Indian Library Science Abstracts [ILSA] -Volume 45-49 (2011-2015) - Recently Published

Indian Library Science Abstracts (ILSA), being brought out by IASLIC since1967, is the only national abstracting and indexing journal of India in the field of library and information Science. Due to the phenomenal growth of LIS literature in India in English as well as regional languages and the lack of volunteer professionals it has become a herculean task to collect, organize and compile data for the ILSA. The last cumulative volume (Vols. 40-44, 2006-2010) was published in 2018, the print copies as well as e-copies (in CD) of which are available for sale at IASLIC Office.

ILSA Volumes: 45-49 (2011-2015) published in July, 2023. The volume consists of 1365 entries from 17 journals and 6 conference proceedings. Complete bibliographical description of the abstracted document as furnished in the source journal has been provided in order to facilitate the users to identify the document. The volume consists of two parts: Main or Classified Part and Index Part. Entries in the main/classified part are primarily arranged according to the classified order by adopting 22nd ed. of DDC.

We humbly acknowledge the patronage of the honourable members of the Editorial Board. We also gratefully acknowledge commercial and academic publishers, LIS schools, research institutes, professional associations, library and information science professionals for their encouragement and support in getting data from various sources distributed in different states of India. CONFERENCE/SEMINAR/TRAINING/WORKSHOP 33rd IASLIC All India Conference: A brief Report

The ICSSR sponsored, IASLIC 33RD ALL INDIA CONFER-ENCE on "Collaborative Librarianship" organised by the Department of Library and Information Science, Pondicherry University, on December 7-8, 2023. This national conference received an overwhelming response. Around 150 delegates participated in the conference.

The inaugural ceremony of the conference began with a University Anthem and Prof. Sevukan, the Organizing Secretary welcomed the dignitaries and the august gathering. The conference was opened by lighting the lamp by Prof. Tharanikkarasu, Honourable Vice-Chancellor of Pondicherry University along with other dignitaries Honourable Vice-Chancellor of Pondicherry University released the Book of Abstracts.

- Shri. Abhijit Kumar, Hony General Secretary IASLIC gave an overview of ISALIC and its role in supporting the LIS professionals. He thanked the organisers and their team for their support and technical modalities in pursuance of the conference program. He also mentioned that Pondicherry University organising its 2nd IALSIC event at Pondicherry. He mentioned that 38 papers were accepted for presentation and 8 papers for poster presentation.
- Prof. Narendra Lahkar, President of IASLIC, in his Presidential address emphasise the importance of Collaboration and co-operation among library professionals.
 He said that IASLIC motivates LIS professionals to work together to move towards advancement.
- Prof. Tharanikkarasu, Hon'ble. Vice-Chancellor Pondicherry University delivered the inaugural address. In his inaugural speech, he highlighted the silent role played by the Libraries for the development of the academic community. Further, he said the library is the soul of educational institutions. He also emphasized the need for library professionals to have multi-tasking skills.
- Prof. Ravi in his keynote address highlighted the significance of libraries and their role as a driving force in the modern era. He also said that it is a profession of silence and achievement.
- This was followed by the presentation of IASLIC. Prof. AK Mukherjee IASLIC Lifetime Achievement Award for Retired Librarian for the year 2018 was conferred on Dr. A.L. Moorthy, Former Director-DESIDOC, while that for the year 2019 was conferred on Dr.V K Thomas, former University Librarian, Viswa-Bharati, Santiniketan, West Bengal.
- Dr R. Jeyshankar, Joint Organizing Secretary & HoD, LIS Pondicherry University, proposed a vote of thanks, and Mr. Ashutosh Kumar Singh was the master of ceremony anchored the inaugural program.
- Thematic sessions on Collaborative Librarianship followed the inaugural session. Dr. M. Vijayakumar, Con-

- ference Director and Pondicherry University Librarian, gave the overview of the conference.
- In the thematic session, Prof. Narendra Lahkar, President of IASLIC, delivered a lecture on Collaborative Librarianship: The need for Pro-Active efforts. He spoke about the importance of collaboration and co-operation among the librarians.
- Dr. Elavazhagan, Librarian and chief Knowledge Officer delivered an invited talk on Collaborative Collection Development and Knowledge Sharing. He highlighted various issues emerging in the licensing agreement and price negotiation. Also highlighted the uniqueness of the IIM Libraries Consortium. This session was Chaired by Dr. V K Thomas, and Smt. Sanjukta Roy was the Rapporteur.

The first technical session on the Concept of Collaborative Librarianship was chaired by Prof. Dr. K.G Sudhier, CUTN, Tiruvarur and Dr. Vijaykumar, Assistant Librarian, Pondicherry University, served as Rapporteur. There were eight papers, out of which two papers were presented. The second technical session was chaired by Dr K.M Shibu, Assistant Librarian, Pondicherry University and Mr Samuel D Raja, CMC served as Rapporteur. This session has six papers in which three papers were presented. In the evening, the organising team offered a feast in the form of a Cultural Program, which Dr. Rekha R.V, PU co-ordinated.

Dr V K Thomas delivered the IASLIC – PC Shah 6th Memorial Lecture on "Equitable delivery of library services: a case of non-users. He said that more attention needs to be given to non-users or underserved users.

On the second day of the conference, Dr. Venkatakesavan, Head Times Archives and Knowledge Centre, Mumbai delivered an invited talk on Mass Media Information & Knowledge Services in the Digital Era. He highlighted how Media Librarianship today is witnessing tremendous change, the changing concepts and developments in ICTs, rapid growth of information resources (both in volume and variety), changing user needs, etc., has made a great impact on their business which in turn demands innovative information skill to inspire the user community. This session was Chaired by Prof. Panigrahi and Dr. Bina Medhi Lahkar served as a rapporteur.

The Third technical session was chaired by Dr R. Jeyshankar, HoD, LIS Pondicherry University and Dr. Kohila GT served as Rapporteur. This session has seven papers in which six papers were presented. The fourth technical session was chaired by Dr Rekha, associate professor of LIS Pondicherry University, and Dr. Nilakshi Sharma served as rapporteur. There were four papers, and all the authors presented their papers. Prof. S K Singh of Gauhati University chaired the fifth technical session, and Dr. Baskar served as rapporteur. There were four papers, in which three papers were presented. The sixth technical session was chaired by Dr S K Senapati and Dr. Sivasubramanian served as Rapporteur. There were eight papers, in which five papers were presented along with one Poster paper presentation.

On December 7, 2023, at 9.30 am the IASLIC Governing Body (2023-25) meeting was held and the General Body meeting of IASLIC was held on 8 Dec 2023.

Dr. Ashis Biswas, Librarian, Victoria Institution (College), Kolkata, delivered an insightful talk that focused on the technical aspects of preprint repositories and their impact on the dissemination of research findings. Dr. Biswas provided a clear definition of preprint repositories and highlighted their fundamental purpose in accelerating the sharing of research outputs before formal peer review. The speaker delved into the technical aspects of preprint repositories, discussing the underlying architecture, data structures, and protocols involved. UNESCO Guidelines for the Governance

of Digital Platforms

UNESCO has released its Guidelines for the Governance of Digital Platforms, the result of a year's work involving a wide variety of stakeholders, including the Internet4Trust conference in February which attracted over 4000 par-

ticipants. The final version of UNESCO's guidelines on how digital platforms – and in particular social media – should work offers helpful affirmation of the importance of access to information, skills, and libraries. It also provides a framework for us to engage in wider debates about information regulation. At the heart of the Guidelines there are a set of five principles. These are:

- Platforms should conduct human rights due diligence this should take place in general and before any major changes, and incorporate a full variety of perspectives.
- 2. Platforms should adhere to international human rights standards, including in platform design, content moderation and content curation this should involve non-discrimination by design, moderation in local languages (as well as support for moderators, who otherwise can have a terrible job), a variety of responses to harmful content, auditing processes, avoiding promoting content that would generally be seen as illegal.
- 3. Platforms should be transparent crucial to achieving the above is transparency, both in terms of setting out terms of service, and showing clearly how platforms comply with them. This covers everything from moderation, advertising, complaints and appeals, safeguards for freedom of expression, and ensuring access to data for researchers, civil society and media
- 4. Platforms should make information and tools available for users this refers to ensuring that users understand processes and their rights, in particular in their own language.
- 5. Platforms should be accountable to relevant stakeholders there should be effective complaints mechanisms that take account of local needs.

OBITUARY

Prof (Dr) Manorama Srinath, Former Professor and Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Madras breathed her last on 18 January, 2024 at the age of 77. A distinguished academician and a stalwart in the field of Library and Information Science, Prof Srinath was born on 3 July 1946. With a rich educational background, including a B Sc, M A, M L I S and Ph D degree, she made significant contributions to the Department of Library and Information Science at the University of Madras. Dr Manorama Srinath served in various capacities during her tenure at the University of Madras, starting from Lecturer to Professor. She not only mentored numerous Ph D candidates at the University of Madras but also extended her guidance to scholars from other universities on topics ranging from information-seeking behavior to GIS applications. Beyond her academic achievements, Dr Manorama Srinath actively engaged in consultancy services, delivered lectures in refresher courses, summer schools and participated in co-curricular activities. Dr Srinath's involvement with professional bodies, such as MALA, ILA, IATLIS, IASLIC, TLA, reflected her commitment to the broader library and information science community. The passing of Prof (Dr)

Manorama Srinath is a great loss to the academic community and her legacy will be remembered with gratitude and respect. IASLIC deeply mourns her death.

Sri Arun Kumar Roy, the President of the Bengal Library Association and one of the leaders of Library Movement in Bengal died on January 5th, 2024 at the medical unit of Students' Health Home. Kolkata at the age of 85. He, the youngest son of his parents, was born on 13th January 1939 in Kazigram of Maymonsin district of present Bangladesh. As a student of the Bengal Library Association, Arun babu joined in the library movement in the year 1963. Vijayamangalam was historically a part of Kongu Nadu. This town was an ancient vijayamlangalam was instorically a part or kongo vadu. I mis ouwi was air ancient settlement of Jains, Vijayamangalam Jain temple was built in [678 C.E. by King Konguvelir of Velir dynasty. There is an inscription inside the temple that talks of the beauty of Perunkathai. The Vijayamangalam village is also the tirthplace of a 12th century Jain acharya Bhavanadi, who authored Nann[], a work on Tamil grammar. This temple is the oldest Jain temple in the Kongu Nadu region.





Bannari Amman temple is an Amman temple in the Indian state of Tamil Nadu. It is located near Sathyamangalam, Erode district. The main deity is goddess Mariamman (the goddess of rain), an avatar of goddess Parvathi. The goddess is considered powerful in Tamil and Kannada folklore. Nearly every village in the Kongu region of Tamil Nadu has a

Sangameswarar temple (also called Thirunana and Thirukooduthurai) is a temple in Sangameswarar temple (also called Infurnana and Infukoodufuran) is a temple in Bhavani, in the Forde district, of the Indian state of Tamil Nadu, It is a Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva. It is 15 km from Erode. The temple was built at the confluence of rivers Kaveri, Bhavani and the mystic Amutha (Agaya Gangai). The temple was praised in old Tamil Itterature as Thirunana. The place is also known as Dakshina Triveri Sangamam and Kooduthurai indicating the confluence of three rivers. Devotees perform last rites for ancestors on the riverbank and offer prayers at the Sangameshwarar temple.





Bhavanisagar Dam or Lower Bhavani Dam is located in Erode district, Tamil Nadu, India.The dam is constructed on the Bhavani river. It is one of the world's largest earthen dams. The dam receives water from two main catchment areas in the western ghats.

Vellode Birds Sanctuary is a bird sanctuary located in Erode District, Tamil Nadu, India. The sanctuary covers an area of .77 km2 (0.30 sq mi). The sanctuary is located near Vellode, about 12 km from Erode. It has been designated as a protected Ramsar site since Velloce, about 12 km from Frode. It has been designated as a protection dambar site since 2022 The sanctuary is built around Periyakulam lake surrounded with bushes. More than 20,000 birds visit during the migration period from November to March. The sanctuary features thousands of birds coming from various countries, some of which can be easily identified. The bird species include bar-headed goose, black-tailed godwit, barn swallow, woolly-necked stork, Eurasian spoonbill, greater spotted eagle, blue-tailed bee-eater, little stint, spot billed pelican, purple



swamphen, and yellow wagtail



Arulmigu Velayuthaswamy Thirukovil, also known as the Thindalmalai Murugan Temple Arumigu velayunaswamy Inrukovii, aiso known as in e Innoamana inurugan iengia is a Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Murugan, located on Thindalmalai hillock near Erode, Tamil Nadu, India. The primary deity is Sri Velayudhaswami (Murugan). The temple houses a golden chariot Temple Car, used to carry images of gods in ceremonial processions. It is about 7 km from Central Bus stand at Swastik Circle, 8 km from Erode Junction. The Temple is well connected to by local buses running in-between Erode Central Bus Terminus and Perundurai.
