Indian Library Science Abstracts (ILSA), being brought out by IASLIC since 1967, is the only national abstracting and indexing journal of India in the field of library and information Science. Due to the phenomenal growth of LIS literature in India in English as well as regional languages and the lack of volunteer professionals it has become a herculean task to collect, organize and compile data for the ILSA. The last cumulative volume (Vols. 40-44, 2006-2010) was published in 2018, the print copies as well as e-copies (in CD) of which are available for sale at IASLIC Office.

ILSA Volumes: 45-49 (2011-2015) will be published in June, 2023. The volume consists of 1365 entries from 17 journals and 6 conference proceedings. Complete bibliographical description of the abstracted document as furnished in the source journal has been provided in order to facilitate the users to identify the document. The volume consists of two parts: Main or Classified Part and Index Part. Entries in the main/classified part are primarily arranged according to the classified order by adopting 22nd ed. of DDC.

We humbly acknowledge the patronage of the honourable members of the Editorial Board. We also gratefully acknowledge commercial and academic publishers, LIS schools, research institutes, professional associations, library and information science professionals for their encouragement and support in getting data from various sources distributed in different states of India. ## TECHNOLOGY NEWS

### Evaluating the Effectiveness of Library Management System Based on Usage Statistics

Libraries today rely on data-driven decisions to improve how well their Library Management System serves users. They need real-time access to important library management statistics in order to accomplish this. To plan, develop, and evaluate their services, libraries gather a variety of statistics. Budgeting, collection development, deselection and cancellation decisions, as well as discussions with vendors, are all aided by the statistics. According to **Marshall Breeding (2014)** "Analytics help libraries adjust the way they perform their work, improve efficiency, and make better use of their financial and human resources to maximize the impact of their collection and services."

**Usage Statistics:** It means collecting, analyzing and presenting the usage data to evaluate the true relevancy and value of a service. For the purposes of creating, analyzing, and planning their services, libraries gather a variety of statistics. Circulation, visits, collection, acquisitions, use of electronic resources, reference/chat interactions, and library education sessions are a few examples.

**Online Search Statistics:** It is a very important usage statistic for library professionals to better know the educational needs of users. This involves the online catalogue search report that gives the amount of searching done within a system. This information assists the librarian in determining whether improvements to cataloguing practices or the search interface are required. Search metrics are extracted on the basis of searching the library catalogue based on types of items (e-Books, print books, e-journals, audios, videos, etc.) and also on the basis of categories of

users (faculty, UG, and PG) or students and researchers, etc

**Circulation Statistics:** This gives an idea of what types of items are in demand. Which category of users (faculty, students, or researchers) requires which type of document more? This allows librarians to determine which types of media (physical vs. electronic, or book vs. e-book) are in demand and react proactively to user behavior. The renewal statistics can tell you what kinds of titles are in high demand, and the number of times holds are placed on specific items can tell you how popular they are.

**Acquisition statistics:** This gives the budget spent on a particular type of item and lets us decide to reshuffle the budget classification based on the popularity of items.

**E-Resources Usage Statistics:** The growing popularity of e-resources in libraries presents the need for useful, consistent, and timely usage data for assessment and decision-making.

**Baker & Read (2008)** defined e-resources usage statistics as a "specified set of data elements to help libraries measure the use of their electronic resources" to evaluate subscriptions and to determine value and return on investment (ROI) for libraries.

Libraries must pay special attention to the relative capabilities of different systems for harnessing data and analytics to generate useful results as they examine their upcoming expenditures in automation infrastructure. Proxy Server Logs, Link resolvers and, Google analytics are the metrics that libraries can collect to measure the usage of their online resources. Few Examples of Library Management Systems having Analytcs Software are: Ex Libris: Alma Ana-

lytics and Primo Analytics, FOLIO Project, OCLC. Based on the above statistics, we can decide which LMS (Library Management System) will be most suitable for us to cater to our needs at the optimum level. To manage both types of resources (print and electronic), we need an integrated LMS that has the capacity to effectively manage both types of resources.

## OBITUARY

**Dr. Pushpa Dhyani, Former Head & Associate Professor, Department of Library & Information Science, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur (11.08.1938 - 27.04.2023)**

Dr. Pushpa Dhyani, M.A., M. Lib. Sc., Ph. D., was Associate Professor in the Department of Library and Information Science, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. She served the University as Head, Dean and other positions in the University of Rajasthan from 11th October 1965 to 31st August 1998. She was a scholar of international repute in her discipline. She had the distinction of being the first Indian woman Ph.D. in Library and Information Science on the topic "Use of library classification schemes in India libraries with special reference to Delhi" in 1979 under Prof. S. N. Srivastava from the University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. Dr. Dhyani had marked her impact in the academic field as a scholar, teacher and research guide. To the world of library and Information Science, Dr. Dhyani is a well-known scholar. She



was the life member of IASLIC, ILA and IATLIS. Her contribution in the area of Classification and Documentation in national and international journals is of great academic value. Dr. Pushpa Dhyani guided 8 Ph.D. Research Scholars. Her students and Research Scholars obtained top positions in Library and Information Science. Dr. Dinesh Kumar Gupta, Professor, Central University of Haryana and Prof. Purnima Kaushik, Former Head, Department of Library & Information Science, University of Rajasthan, were her research scholars. Her first monumental work was published as "Classification Schemes and Indian Libraries (1983)". The works of Dr. Dhyani were based on the demands and needs of the discipline in general and of the academic community in particular. The innumerable articles of Dr. Dhyani published in national and international journals are also an ample testimony of her innovative and original ideas. The other major works of Dr. Dhyani are - Dhyani's Guide to Dewey Decimal Classification (Ed. 18 and 19) (1985), Information Science and Libraries (1990), Working With Dewey Decimal Classification (Ed. 19 and 20) (1994), Directory of Information Services and computer Application - Indian Libraries (1994), Library Classification Theory and Principles (1998) and Dhyani's Glossarium of Library and Information Science Terms (English - Hindi) (2001). Dr. Dhyani had devised her own characteristic style and method for presenting and analysing the cobwebs of library and information

science. On the sad demise of Dr. Pushpa Dhyani Madam on 27th April 2023, the Department of Library & Information Science conducted a condolence meeting in the Department on 1st May 2023.
