Message from the President



*AI Application in Libraries: the Most Important Topic for LIS Conferences. I am writing this piece for the esteemed members of the IASLIC and all young professionals with a conviction that AI has become the most important topic for discussion in LIS oriented conferences and seminars. The subject is gaining popularity at a fast pace, overshadowing once popular subjects like digital library development. A recent book titled *If One Builds It, Everyone Dies: The Case Against Superintelligent AI* by Eliezer Yudkowsky and Nate Soares has given a fearful and negative view of AI. A detailed review of this book has been published in the journal *Times Literary Supplement*, September 19, 2025. The fundamental message in this book, which considers the opinions of many professional groups and stakeholders, is somewhat disturbing. "If someone builds artificial general intelligence (AGI), the human species will go extinct". A similar view was aired by a renowned physicist, Late Stephen Hawking who said that it would be doomsday for humanity when machines become more intelligent than human beings. The author of the book says, "given the economic incentive, the race to superintelligence is inevitable. The only thing humanity can do is to persuade or force world leaders to put a stop to it". And if we fail to do this, the world would be doomed. However, the reviewer of this book has presented a balanced view. He says that conditions may warrant us to see possible ways to resist the development of AGI. Government all over the world might go for treaties that would minimise the possibility of "rogue AI". And AI scientists might go for systems that would disrupt malicious AI. Human societies should have closer surveillance of emerging systems. The question before us is how we can build "better and trustworthy AI" rather than getting trapped in a "rabbit hole of despair". What is in store for the future? We do not know. It has been rightly said that the only certainty about the future is uncertainty.*

Report

LIB-BRIDGE 2026: International Conference (DRTC)-
A Report

The International Conference LIB-BRIDGE 2026 was organized by the Documentation Research and Training Centre (DRTC), Indian Statistical Institute, Bangalore, during the period 11–13 March 2026. Dr. Biswanath Dutta Associate Professor at DRTC was the Convener of LIB-BRIDGE 2026. It focused on the theme Bridging the Gap: Trends in Library and Information Science—Connecting Practice, Education and Innovation. The conference aimed to provide a collaborative platform for academicians, professionals, researchers, and students to engage in discussions on emerging trends and key challenges in the field of Library and Information Science (LIS). The conference highlighted the transformation of libraries into technology-driven knowledge hubs. Key themes included digital transformation, artificial intelligence (AI), research data management, semantic technologies, and user-centred services. A total of 40 peer-reviewed papers across 13 thematic tracks were presented by 106 authors from 21 Indian states and

international contributors, reflecting strong collaborative endeavours (90% were multi-authored papers). Also, there was a gender parity in the authorship pattern. Day 1 Highlights: The conference commenced with workshop sessions conducted by Biswanath Dutta on research data management and open science, emphasizing the evolving role of librarians as data stewards. The workshop also demonstrated the use of the CKAN platform for effective research data management. The inaugural session featured a distinguished address by Fausto Giunchiglia (University of Trento, Italy), who highlighted the challenges of ontology reuse and proposed modular, purpose-driven approaches. An invited talk by Prashant Kumar Sinha focused on the essential skill sets and emerging opportunities for LIS professionals in the industry. Research paper presentation sessions covered AI in publishing, LIS curriculum reform aligned with the National Education Policy 2020, and applications of classification principles in computer vision. Day 2 Highlights Day 2 focused on AI, digital infrastructures, and LIS education. The keynote by Prof. Allen H. Renear (University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, USA) emphasized leadership-oriented LIS education and interdisciplinary learning. Invited talks explored AI-driven knowledge organization tools like automated indexing systems. An invited talk by Prof. Partha Sarathi Mukhopadhyay, Kalyani University, focused on AI usage in library cataloguing and its integration with KOHA LMS. Research paper presentations addressed topics such as linked open data, digital workflows, research data services, and user behaviour in e-resource usage. A panel discussion involving experts like Prof. K. S. Raghavan, Prof. Allen H. Renear, Shri. N. V. Sathyanarayana, Dr. P. R. Goswami, and Dr. Rajesh Singh highlighted the gap between LIS education and industry expectations, stressing curriculum reform, technical skill development, and stronger industry engagement. Day 3 Highlights: The final day emphasized human-centered AI and future-ready librarianship. The keynote by Prof. Fernando Loizides focused on accessibility and inclusive design. Sessions explored conversational AI, semantic frameworks,



metaverse libraries, and linked data applications.

Research paper presentations highlighted emerging areas such as AI integration in LIS curricula, chatbot evaluation, sustainability of library systems, and the transition toward

linked data and semantic web technologies. Key Outcomes & Recommendations The conference concluded with the following major recommendations: Strengthening industry–academia collaboration to align education with practice. Integrating AI, data analytics, and digital technologies into LIS curricula. Promoting practice-based learning through internships and projects. Developing interdisciplinary i-Schools combining LIS with data science and IT. Encouraging research, innovation, and collaborative projects in LIS. LIB-BRIDGE 2026 successfully underscored the need to bridge the gap between theory and practice in LIS. It reinforced the importance of technological adaptation, interdisciplinary learning, and continuous innovation to prepare professionals for the evolving information landscape. Dr. Biswanath Dutta, Convener of LIB-BRIDGE 2026, acknowledged and expressed sincere appreciation for the financial support and collaboration extended by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), Government of India; the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), Government of India; and the Sarada Ranganathan Endowment for Library Science (SRELS).

P.C. Chandra Group Boosts College Libraries through 'Gyandhara' Project

As part of its ongoing Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative, the P.C. Chandra Group organized the eighth edition of its 'Gyandhara' project at P.C. Chandra



Garden, where financial grants were awarded to upgrade the library infrastructure of various colleges across West Bengal. During the event, the group's Joint Managing Director, Shri Suvro Chandra, alongside noted singer Rupankar Bagchi, presented checks of ₹2 lakh each to the principals of 27 colleges primarily located in rural and peripheral areas. The primary objective of this grant is to transform traditional college libraries into modern knowledge centers by facilitating the procurement of new books, research journals, and digital resources, and by enhancing laboratory facilities. Since its inception in 2015, the 'Gyandhara' project has benefited 108 colleges, reflecting the group's commitment to strengthening the educational landscape and ensuring that students from

underprivileged regions have access to high-quality academic resources.

ASLIP Activities - Interesting and Inspiring

The acronym ASLIP stands for "Association of Senior Library and Information Professionals". A registered professional body, it is dedicated to the cause of the development of libraries and information professionals of India. It enjoys a substantial membership comprising serving and retired library professionals from India and abroad. The office bearers of ASLIP have served in various academic and professional institutions of repute. ASLIP is a unique professional platform which gives opportunities to library professionals to upgrade themselves through learning and sharing. It has been organizing its annual conclave in collaboration with different institutions, which is called 'ASLIP Conclave'. The first conclave was held at JLN Medical College, Ajmer, the second at CSIR-Institute of Microbial Technology (CSIR-IMTECH), Chandigarh and the third at Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agricultural University (CCSHAU), Hisar, in 2023, 2024 and 2025, respectively. This year's noteworthy activity was 'ASLIP Walk', which was widely participated in for collectiveness, health and happiness. Apart from technical sessions and panel discussions, this conclave also witnesses other unique activities like 'ASLIP QUIZ' coordinated by Dr. Deepti Madaan, Fireside Chat by Dr. Neeza Singh and Talent hunt by Dr. R. P. Kumar. The ASLIP Talent Hunt Contest is one of its own kind as a thought-provoking topic is selected by the executive committee of ASLIP. Participants are supposed to write a short essay on the selected topic. After that, the participants send their respective write-ups in a sealed envelope to the official address of ASLIP within the stipulated time. This is followed by a thorough evaluation of submitted entries by the committee constituted for this purpose. The final result is declared during the ASLIP Conclave held in that particular year. The first prize winner of ASLIP Talent Hunt Contest 2025 was Dr. Tridib Chattopadhyay. Dr. Chattopadhyay is a diligent, sincere and dedicated library professional, working in St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College, Kolkata. He is a Convener of the Study Circle Division of IASLIC. Dr. Chattopadhyay is an asset to ASLIP.
