The IASLIC 33rd All India Conference 2023 will be organised in collaboration with the Department of Library & Information Science, Pondicherry University, Puducherry, India and is scheduled to be held at the Pondicherry University, Puducherry, during December 7-9, 2023.

No library (or information centre or knowledge resource centre), how much big it may be, can be self-sufficient to fully satisfy its users, if it functions in isolation. Cooperation and collaboration among these organizations can be of a great help in rendering effective library and information services by enhancing the satisfaction level of their user communities. Realizing the benefits of collaboration, libraries have been undertaking resource sharing initiatives since long. Consequently, the concept of **Collaborative Librarianship** has emerged which focuses on the partnership and sharing of resources and expertise between libraries. Collaboration and partnership among libraries started with the extension of inter-library loan facilities. Automation of libraries and advancement in networking technology brought an opportunity for developing library networks which created modern avenues for resource sharing. Later, the concept of library consortia was conceived, which became very popular and several library consortia started functioning at national and international levels. Increasingly libraries are feeling the urgency to develop and exploit library collaboration/ partnerships, for which it is necessary to think widely and creatively about new types of, and potentials for, such collaboration/partnerships. Hence, IASLIC has selected '**Collaborative Librarianship**' as the main theme of its 33rd All India Conference. 1. Contributed papers must have to be of qualitative value for publishing in the **IASLIC Special Publication** (ISSN 0972-3668) Volumen-60, a peer-reviewed post-Conference publication. A generalised presentation, thus, should be avoided.
- 2.. Full research paper within 2500 words (not more than 10 pages of A4 paper-size), along with an informative abstract (between 300 and 400 words), typed in double space on single side, in Times New Roman 12pt font size, with margin of 1.5” on all sides should be submitted in **duplicate (hard copy) by October 07, 2023.**
3. Authors’ declaration in prescribed format for the conference must be signed by all author(s) sequentially and submitted along with the full paper indicating distinctly

the sub-theme and topic of the paper.

4. Declaration by the author(s) should be made separately in a hardcopy that the paper has not been sent elsewhere for publication/ presentation.
5. Softcopy of the full paper composed in .doc / .docx format should be submitted as an attachment through e-mail to [iaslic.sem@gmail.com](mailto:iaslic.sem@gmail.com).
6. For bibliographical references and citations, contributors are required to follow strictly the **IASLIC Authorship Manual including Standard and Specification** [http://www.iaslic1955.org.in/fckeditor/userfiles/file/Publication\\_policy\\_Authorship\\_Manual\\_final.pdf](http://www.iaslic1955.org.in/fckeditor/userfiles/file/Publication_policy_Authorship_Manual_final.pdf)

The paper should be accompanied with an amount of Rs 1000.00 (Rupees one thousand only) as paper submission fee which will be adjusted with the Registration Fee only by the Organising Secretary subject to the production of the respective original payment receipt of IASLIC. ### *The 341th Study Circle Meeting of IASLIC: A brief report*

IASLIC organized its 341st Study Circle meeting on June 22, 2023, at its Headquarters in Kolkata. The esteemed speaker for the event was Dr. Raj Kumar Bhardwaj, the Librarian of St. Stephen's College, Delhi. Dr. Bhardwaj delivered a captivating talk on the topic "Lessons from the Life and Philosophy of Dr. S. R. Ranganathan in the Context of Data-Driven Librarianship."

During his presentation, Dr. Bhardwaj shed light on the remarkable journey of Dr. S. R. Ranganathan, who faced numerous hardships in his personal life. However, through unwavering determination and perseverance, Dr. Ranganathan ultimately achieved great heights within the LIS domain. The speaker emphasized the pivotal role played by individuals such as Edward Ross, who generously supported Dr. Ranganathan by paying his admission fee during his student days. Additionally, Dr. Bhardwaj highlighted Dr. Ranganathan's lifelong religious devotion, sharing that he would read one passage of Shri Balmiki Ramayana every day. Furthermore, the speaker discussed the enduring relevance of Dr. Ranganathan's philosophy, drawing connections to the field of data-driven librarianship. Dr. Bhardwaj emphasized the importance of data storytelling and its significant impact on modern librarianship. He encouraged libraries to proactively collect data, enabling its reuse and promoting effective data management practices. Furthermore, he argued that the five laws of library science align more closely with data management than the FAIR principles, thus advocating for revisit Dr. Ranganathan's philosophy in the context of data management practices. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A session, where participants posed various thought-provoking questions.

Overall, the 341st Study Circle meeting organized by IASLIC proved to be an enlightening and engaging event, providing valuable insights into the life, philosophy, and its application in the realm of data-driven librarianship.

### Festival of Libraries during August 5 and 6, 2023 at Pragati Madian, New Delhi

Book your date with iconic world libraries as city gears up to host unique festival. A unique festival of libraries to be held at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi will launch a special ranking system for libraries across India. Aimed at encouraging reading culture, the two day festival, to be held during August 5 and 6, will also hold exhibitions on allied crafts like cartography, calligraphy and cursive writing besides setting in motion the creation of a crowdsourced directory of all reasonably large collections of books in the country. The Festival will be inaugurated by Hon’ble President of Indi, Ms Droupadi Murmu on August 5, 2023. and Valedictory Ceremony will be presided by Hon’ble Vice President of India, Jagdeep Dhankhar on August 6, 2023.

The festival will highlight iconic libraries from across the world in order to initiate a conversation on the modernisation and digitisation of libraries in India and discuss a special policy for the development of libraries down to village and community levels. India has 54,856 public libraries. The Culture Ministry through the Raja Rammohun Roy Library Foundation (RRRL) promotes public library systems and services in India. The RRRL foundation provides annual funding and support to nearly 6,0007,000 libraries across the country, as of now.

The government had in 2014 also launched a special mission called the National Mission on Libraries (NML) with a budget allocation of ₹400 crore. Under the scheme, six libraries under the Culture Ministry, 35 Central libraries in States and 35 district libraries are to be developed as model libraries with an emphasis on developing these libraries in economically backward districts.

The August event is likely to be attended by organisers of literary festivals, well-known authors, publishing houses, proprietors of book cafes and translators.

“It aims to bring together all stakeholders — from librarians and academics to district collectors of 100 districts

and directors of model libraries to develop a roadmap for encouraging libraries to become the drawing rooms of the community," a Ministry official said.

Panel discussions on best practices in libraries from across the globe and technical advancements like translating software, and audio books are also lined up. The festival will be open to private and public libraries as well as book collections at community and village levels.

Connected Papers is a unique, visual tool to help researchers and applied scientists find and explore papers relevant to their field of work.

How does it work?

To create each graph, it analyzes an order of ~50,000 papers and select the few dozen with the strongest connections to the origin paper.

In the graph, papers are arranged according to their similarity. That means that even papers that do not directly cite each other can be strongly connected and very closely positioned. Connected Papers is not a citation tree.

The similarity metric is based on the concepts of Co-citation and Bibliographic Coupling. According to this measure, two papers that have highly overlapping citations and references are presumed to have a higher chance of treating a related subject matter.

The algorithm then builds a Force Directed Graph to distribute the papers in a way that visually clusters similar

papers together and pushes less similar papers away from each other. Upon node selection we highlight the shortest path from each node to the origin paper in similarity space. The database is connected to the Semantic Scholar Paper Corpus (licensed under ODC-BY). Their team has done an amazing job of compiling hundreds of millions of published papers across many scientific fields.
