

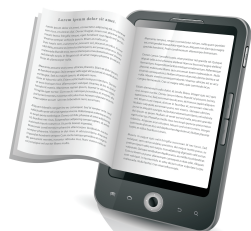

- Full paper within 2500 words (not more than 10 pages of A4 size paper), along with an informative abstract (between 300 and 400 words), typed in double space on single side, in Times New Roman 12pt size font, with margin of 1.5" on all sides, and duly signed by the author(s) should be submitted **in triplicate by July 15, 2017**, along with Author's/Authors' declaration in prescribed format.
- For bibliographical references, contributors are requested to strictly follow the IASLIC style mentioned in the 'Guidelines for Authors' (available at http://www.iaslic1955.org.in/fckeditor/userfiles/file/Publication_policy_Guidelines_Auth_final2016.pdf)

5. In addition, softcopy of the full paper composed in MS Word should be submitted on CD/DVD disc or as an attachment through e-mail to iaslic.sem@gmail.com.
6. Author should indicate the facet and topic of the paper distinctly.
7. The paper should be accompanied with an amount of 1000.00 (Rupees one thousand only) as paper submission fee which will be adjusted only with the Registration Fee by the Organising Secretary subject to the production of the respective original receipt of IASLIC. Payment may be made by DD/Cheque in favour of **IASLIC, payable at Kolkata** and sent to Shri Sajalkanti Goswami, Hony. 'People Ready to Pay for Good Content on Web'

Michael Golden, Vice-chairman, *The New York Times*, believes that the readers will pay for good and meaningful content on the web despite the fact that there is so much of free information on the web, says a report by Vinay Kamath published in *The Hindu Businessline*. The newspaper group had seen advertising revenues plunge in the last decade but digital revenues, more so subscriptions, where people pay to read the *NYT* on the web, had been growing, even faster than digital ad revenues, he informed. Speaking at a Digital Media summit in New Delhi, organised by WAN-IFRA, a world association of newspapers and publishers, recently, Golden said that the *NYT* was focussed on consumer (subscription) revenue as the main driver. "It's now 60 per cent of revenue, while 40 per cent is advertising. That includes its print subscriptions as well", he said. "Just 10 years ago, 70 per cent of our revenues was from advertising and 30 per cent was from consumer. It would be nice if advertising revenue stayed steady, but that's not happening," he added. Pages of First Printed Book in England Discovered

The University of Reading in UK has discovered pages of one of the first books printed in England, dating from the 15th century, according to a report in www.independent.co.uk website. The pages of a mediaeval priest's handbook, dating to between 1476 and 1477, were found in the University's archives by Special Collections librarian Erika Delbecque while she was cataloguing thousands of items showing the history of print and graphic design. They were produced by English printer William Caxton and the two pages are valued at around £100,000. "This well preserved item is the only one of its kind, and one of just two surviving fragments from this mediaeval Caxton book in existence", said Ms. Delbecque. "The leaf had previously been pasted into another book for the undignified purpose of reinforcing its spine. We understand it was rescued by a librarian at the University of Cambridge in 1820, who had no idea that it was an original Caxton leaf", said Ms. Delbecque. Hundreds of years ago, printing was a costly and laborious process. Cloth was dissolved in water and the mixture was dried in thin sheets on which to write, and the pads used to ink the type were soaked in urine. Library for Locals in Police Building

The Deputy Commissioner of Police Zone-2 of Ahmedabad, Usha Rada, has taken a unique initiative of providing a room in her office at Karanj Bhavan in Karanj area for a library for locals, says a report by Sarfaraz Shaikh published in *The Times of India*. The library will have books regarding every subject that would help students of the area prepare for various exams. Gujarat Co-coordinator of NGO Helping Hand, Sajid Syed, said that they were getting books on subsidized rates from different publishers to keep in the library. "The library would just not be limited to students but also for candidates preparing for competitive exams such as police recruitment, etc. We are also gearing up for providing guidance to such candidates who are preparing for competitive exams" added Syed. He informed that apart

from providing a room for library, the whole of Karanj Bhavan has been made a Wi Fi Zone. "The facility can be availed by policemen working in Karanj Bhavan and also visitors who come to Police station building", he added. Braille Library set up at Kochi

In an attempt to make educational and literary materials available to blind and dyslexic children, the Samarthanam Trust for the Disabled has set up a braille and audio library in Kochi, which was inaugurated recently, says a report published in *The Times of India*. The library located at the Raksha Society premises in Mattancherry, Kochi, currently has 600 books under various categories including academic, fiction, self-help and general knowledge. The library also has an MP3 player which will allow students to access audio books. "The main idea of the centre is to assist the educational needs of visually impaired kids who have to go from pillar to post to get their books read," said Mahantesh, founder and managing trustee of Samarthanam Trust. Sale of e-Books goes down in USA

After reaching a peak in 2014, sales of e-readers and e-books have slowed and hardback sales have surged in USA, says a report by Alex Preston published in *The Guardian*. The latest figures from the Publishing Association showed e-book sales falling 17% in 2016, with an 8% rise in their physical counterparts. At the same time, publishers' production values have soared and bookshops have begun to fill up with books with covers of jewel-like beauty, often with gorgeously textured pages. As the great American cover designer Peter Mendelsund puts it, books have "more cloth, more foil, more embossing, page staining, sewn bindings, deckled edges". The Library of Congress has recently signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the Digital Public Library of America to become a "content hub partner" and will ultimately share a significant portion of its rich digital resources with DPLA's database of digital content records, according to a post on Library of Congress website. The first batch of records will include 5,000 items from three major Library of Congress map collections - the Revolutionary War, Civil War and panoramic map collections. "We are pleased to make the Digital Public Library of America a new door through

which the public can access the digital riches of the Library of Congress”, said Librarian of Congress Carla Hayden. “We will be sharing some beautiful, one-of-a-kind historic maps that I think people will really love. They are available online and I hope even more people discover them through DPLA. We couldn't be more thrilled to collaborate closely with the Library of Congress, to work with them on the important mission of maximizing access to our nation's shared cultural heritage”, said DPLA's Executive Director Dan Cohen. New Technique to Prevent Illegal Copying

Scientists have developed an innovative light-based technique to create secure, invisible watermarks that can be used to prevent photos, videos and books from being illegally copied and distributed, according to a *dnaindia.com* report. "In our research, we use a complex pattern of light, or diffraction pattern, as a unique watermark," said Yishi Shi, from the University of Chinese Academy of Sciences. "The invisible watermark

is embedded into the content we are trying to protect. Imperceptibility is one of the most significant advantages of optical watermarking", said Shi. The new approach encodes the optical watermark in a single step. It is faster and uses a less complex optical setup than other optical watermarking approaches previously pursued, researchers said. The technique can also be used to optically encrypt data or to hide information within images. The method is based on a technique called single-shot ptychography encoding (SPE) that uses multiple partially-overlapping beams of light to generate a diffraction pattern from a complex object. Unlike other methods, SPE can encode the optical watermark in a single exposure with no mechanical scanning.
