Report about the 367th Study Circle Meeting of IASLIC

The 367th Study Circle Meeting of IASLIC was held on 16th October, 2025 (Thursday) at 6.00 pm in the meeting room of IASLIC which is situated at P-291, CIT Scheme 6M, Kankurgachhi, Kolkata - 700054. The speaker of the above-mentioned Study Circle Meeting was Mr. Shamba Dutta, Librarian, Maharaja Manindra Chandra College, Kolkata. The Chairman of the meeting was Mr. Pranab Hazra, Former Librarian, Sidho Kanho Birsha University, Purulia, W.B. The Topic of the discussion at the said meeting was "The Development of Libraries in the

Ancient Middle East, their Collections, and Related Affairs". At the beginning, Mr. Abhijit Kumar, General Secretary of IASLIC, welcomed all the dignitaries, guests and audience. Thereafter, Dr. Tridib Chattopadhyay, Convenor, Study Circle Division, IASLIC introduced the Speaker and the Chairman of the session. Mr. Pranab Hazra gave an overview of the issues regarding the development of libraries in the ancient middle east and their collections. After that, the speaker Mr. Shamba Dutta started the session and delivered his lecture on the particular issue. In this lecture Mr. Shamba Dutta discussed the historical development of libraries in the ancient middle east. Mr. Dutta stated with the history of Mesopotamian libraries and the information centres of Ashurbanipal, founded in the 7th century BCE in Nineveh. It contained over 30,000 cuneiform clay tablets. He stated that those libraries have evolved into an extensive collection of literature, religious texts, and scientific knowledge under Ashurbanipal who was a king known for his scholarly pursuits. The library's collection was preserved when the city was destroyed by fire, which baked the clay tablets, and its ruins were later discovered by the archaeologists. He also discussed the history of the library of Alexandria and others. The lecture was followed by a question - answer session. After that the Chairman of the session Mr. Pranab Hazra briefly described the entire content of the discussion. The students, teachers and research scholars have taken part in the discussion. The Chairman stated that he gained a lot of knowledge from this valuable and thought-provoking lecture by Mr. Dutta. Overall, this lecture was appreciated by all. The vote of thanks was delivered by Miss Moumita Ash, Joint Secretary of IASLIC. After that, Dr Tridib Chattopadhyay, Convenor of the Study Circle Division of IASLIC thanked all the dignitaries, guests and the audience regarding their active participation and involvement. The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.

Report on Librarians' Day 2025

Indian Association of Special Libraries and Information Centres (IASLIC), jointly with Bengal Library Association (BLA), West Bengal Public Library Employees Association (WBPLEA) and Department of Library and Information Science, Vidyasagar University observed Librarians' Day 2025 to commemorate 133rd birth anniversary of Dr S R Ranganathan on 17 August, 2025 at Vivekananda Sabhagriha of Vidyasagar University, Paschim Medinipur. The inaugural session was started with a welcome song. Then a condolence message was read and one minute silence was observed. The program was inaugurated by Prof Paresh Chandra Jana, Dean, Faculty of Science, Vidyasagar University. In his inaugural Prof Paresh Chandra Jana expressed his thanks to three associations IASLIC, BLA and WBPLEA. Arindam Gupta, Dean, Faculty of Arts & Commerce was present and graced the occasion. Prof Gupta appreciated the efforts of the organizers in bringing together scholars and professionals. Mr Abhijit Kumar, General Secretary, IASLIC, welcomed the participants who have come not only from Kolkata and neighboring areas but also from different parts of West Bengal. In his address, Mr Kumar mentioned how Librarians' Day Celebration was started in 1990 following a decision at JOCLAI Meeting held at the Jaipur IASLIC Conference in 1989. He also highlighted the role played by IASLIC in organizing Librarians' Day in West Bengal, jointly with BLA and WBPLEA. Dr Joydeep Chanda, General Secretary, Bengal Library Association (BLA) gave a brief account of activities of BLA and said that BLA has organized eight (08) programs at different places of the state after the inaugural program of centenary celebration on 20 December 2024 in Kolkata. He also announced the future Centenary Celebration Programs including Concluding Ceremony on 20 – 21 December 2025 in Kolkata. Extending thanks to Department of Library and Information Science, Vidyasagar University for organizing the 36th Librarians' Day, Mr Saugata Saha, General Secretary of WBPLEA gave a brief account of present condition of public libraries in West Bengal. He expressed his anxiety over future of public library system in West Bengal, where many rural libraries throughout the state were closed or open for one/two days in a week due to paucity of manpower, although some vacant post of rural librarians were filled during last one and half year. Dr Madhup De, renowned scholar, folklorist and writer stressed on the relevance of libraries in the present knowledge society. He shared his experiences as a reader while using different libraries in Medinipur town and neighboring areas. In his Presidential Address, Prof Krishnapada Majumder mentioned the contributions of Ranganathan in the field of library science and library profession. He said, in brief, the beginnings of Librarians' Day Celebration program in the year 1990 throughout different parts of the country and also mentioned the role of IASLIC in this regard. Extending thanks to three speakers for accepting

invitation to speak on a relevant topic, Prof Majumder concluded his address. The inaugural session was ended with vote of thanks proposed by Dr Bidyarthi Datta, Associated Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Vidyasagar University.

The inaugural part was followed by a discussion on the topic "Alternative Avenues for Contemporary Library Service". The discussion was started with the speech of Prof Parthasarathi Mukhopadhyay, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kalyani, Kalyani. In his deliberation, Prof Mukhopadhyay emphasized on the use of modern technology, especially Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning (ML) to organize and provide information in new ways. As Libraries deal with huge amount of information, different AI tools can help librarians to find, sort and present this information faster, he added. Prof Mukhopadhyay concluded by showing how these AI systems can be linked with library software like Koha, enabling on demand DDC classification and LCSH based subject indexing. Dr Parthpratim Ray, Deputy Librarian, Visva-Bharati, Santiniketan spoke on library centric community information Service. Dr Ray discussed different modes of delivering community information services— notice boards, community bulletins, kiosks, outreach programs, and increasingly, digital platforms that can reach even rural populations through mobile phones and the internet. He also noted challenges in providing CIS, including inadequate resources, shortage of trained manpower, low public awareness, technological and language barriers, and sustainability issues. Dr Ray suggested that public libraries can be used as computer training centres, literacy campaign centres and urged librarians to be proactive, use ICT and involve themselves through community information services. Prof Durga Sankar Rath, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Vidyasagar University spoke on the role of public libraries at present which are not only knowledge resource centres but also digital hub. Quoting from Ray Bradbury - "Without libraries what have we? We have no past no future", Prof Rath highlighted the crucial role of libraries especially public libraries in preserving collective memory, facilitating education and fostering an informed citizenry by providing free access to books and information. Prof Rath gave some valuable suggestions on how the library can become an active part of this community. He also emphasized the children's right to read and the role of the library. Prof Rath concluded his speech by discussing the avenues - how library can improve their service quality by embracing technologies, artificial intelligence. Finally, the vote of thanks was proposed by Mr Nayan Pratihar, Secretary, BLA Paschim Medinipur. Altogether 350 participants attended the program. Dr Nivedita Bhattacharya Sahu, Associate Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Vidyasagar University, Paschim Medinipur co-ordinated the entire program.
