The speaker of the above-mentioned Study Circle Meeting was Dr. Sk. Makbul Islam, Associate Professor in Bengali, St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College, Kolkata. The Chairman of the meeting was Dr. Asitabha Das, Former Librarian, University of Kalyani, Nadia, West Bengal, India.

The Topic of the discussion at the said meeting was "Research Methodology: Use of Library (Expectation and Possibilities". At the beginning, Mr. Abhijit Kumar, General Secretary of IASLIC, welcomed all the dignitaries, guests and audience. Thereafter Dr. Tridib Chattopadhyay, Convenor, Study Circle Division, IASLIC, introduced the Speaker and the Chairman of the session. Report on Librarians' Day observation at IASLIC, Kolkata

12th August 2025 was duly observed at IASLIC, Kolkata to commemorate 133rd birth anniversary of Dr. Shiyali Ramamrita Ranganathan. As the auspicious day was celebrated throughout the country as Librarian's Day, the Library division of IASLIC organized garlanding of the portrait of Dr. Ranganathan for paying homage and tribute to the father of Library Science in India. The programme was attended by the teachers, senior librarians, library professionals, budding library professionals and students. Welcoming the audience, Sri Abhijit Kumar, General Secretary of IASLIC remembered the contributions of Dr. S.R Ranganathan, National Professor of Library Science. He recalled the commencement of the Libraraians' Day observation in 1990 following a decision at JOCLAI Meeting held at IASLIC Conference held at Jaipur in 1989. He welcomed Shri Jagamohan Das the senior most member of the EC of IASLIC to preside over the meeting. A befitting tribute was paid by garlanding of the portrait of Dr. Ranganathan and lighting of the lamp ceremony. Shri Jagamohan Das motivated the audience by highlighting the magnitude of dedication and diligence of Dr. Ranganathan towards the Library profession. Professor Krishnapada Majumdar, Former Prabir Roychoudhury Chair Ex-Professor, Dept. of Library and Information Sc., Jadavpur University and Editor, Indian Library Science Abstracts enlightened the audience by reiterating the fact that Dr. Ranganthan was also the father of Library Movement in India and the zeal of the movement should thrive forever . Professor Pijushkanti Panigrahi paid homage to the great personality by highlighting Dr. Ranganathan's service towards the society and he urged the Library Associations like IASLIC, BLA, ILA and others in the country for submitting a collective petition to the Minister of Culture for marking and observing 12 th August as the day of National Importance in India. Prof. Panigrahi also wished that the zealous spirit of the auspicious day to be reflected in the work culture of the library professionals in their everyday life.
